BIOGRAPHY

Evgeniy Molodtsov (b.1987) earned degree in economics at the National Research University – Higher School of Economics (Moscow). Spend one year in Italy studying the culture and economics at the Bologna University. In 2010 became the member of the Union of Photo Artists of Russia, in 2012 – the member of Russian Geographic Society. From 2012 live in Saint Petersburg and attend the Fotodepartament Institute contemporary PostPhotography course.

In 2014 participate in the Parallel program of the European Biennial of Contemporary Art «Manifesta» (Saint Petersburg), hold Grand Prix of the International photofestival «Photoparade» contest (2016), win the contest «Young photographers of Russia» (2017). In 2015-2017 was honored with the Government award in the sphere of culture, the nomination of the Union of photographers of Russia.

The facts of my biography (frequent change of residence, loss of connection with a particular territory and roots) influenced a lot on the formation of my art practice and the theme of my projects. Studying the identity through the reconstruction, appropriation and performative practices, I try to reach the self-identification and understand what it means to be a Russian or someone else. In my projects, I rely on the idea of the return of society to the origins, the general concepts, in an attempt to understand for myself what is really important in defining oneself, one's identity and belonging to a social and cultural community.



Lens Culture, 2013



This project considers landscapes that have been significantly transformed by human activities. The new technologies used to produce these images allow us to imagine how the landscape of the future might look.

In the first part, I compared images from Google Earth with my "herbarium" photos. Google's photos of mines or deforestation were produced by a robot. This automatic eye treats the entire surface of the Earth equally. I created the herbarium photos carefully and individually, using infrared photography. But both images, of the Earth and the plants, become very personal and emotional when viewed through human eyes.

The second series pairs Google images with photos found on Instagram. On the one side, Google's images are the undiscerning seanner of human life, showing it in all its aspects and manifestations. On the other, are the daily snaps of human existence.

The third series pairs Google images of the earth with NASA images of the surface of Mars. One can imagine an extinct civilization on Mars, its waste dumps and mining excavations covered by eons of planetary evolutionary dust, decay, slow absorption and change.

Combined, the series invites its viewers to examine global interconnectedness and reflect on our strong, yet ultimately fragile home.


